
Why develop a NSS?

ISO Methodology - The basic logic



National Standardization Plan

- WHAT: Lists the required National Standards
- WHY: Gives an identification of their priority, including a reason why they are important
- WHEN: Contains a time plan for their development
- WHO: Assigns responsibilities for their development
- HOW MUCH: Associated with a resource plan

National Standardization Strategy

- Identifies required National Standards (assessment of the economy, society, national development plans, stakeholder inputs)
- Assigns ranks to identify the priority of each standard
- Arrives at a (nearly) final list of required standards
- Undertake planning of human and financial resources
- Arrives at a national standardization plan (Standards Work Programme)
- Implements the plan
- Undertakes follow-up activities (monitoring & evaluation)

Determination of needs & priorities to be addressed by standards

Phase 6:

Review/decision on follow-up: Revise, Confirm, Withdraw Standards/ Strengthen their dissemination and implementation

Phase 5:

Monitoring of the effects and impact of standards

Phase 2:

Development/Adoption of standards

Dissemination/Capacity
Building/Training in the use of the standards

Phase 4:

Use/Implementation of the standard

Determining Priorities

Economic importance (e.g. GDP, Export potential)

Social importance/ Critical societal needs

Future needs

Stakeholder views/Input

Analysis of the National Economy

Economic factors considered:

- Gross domestic product
- Trade figures
 - Exports
 - Imports
- Employment contribution

Analysis of Social Non-economic Factors

Social issues considered include:

- Health
- Environment and sustainability
- Education
- Safety (public and industrial)
- Accessibility issues for persons with disabilities
- National security







































Information obtained from same sources as economic information but also includes public concerns and opinion expressed in media


Approach to Stakeholder Engagement

Ranking scheme for the prioritization of standards and projects

Rank	Economic Priorities	Non-economic (Social) Priorities	Priorities derived from Development Plans
1	Very important & urgent	Very serious &urgent problem, public outcry	Great importance in near future
2	Highly important	Serious problem, common occurrence, media attention	Great importance, if conditions apply
3	Moderately important	Serious problem, some media reports	Some importance in medium term
4	Of secondary importance	Problem is localized, no media reaction	Some importance in long term
5	Not important	Other issues	No importance expected

From standardization piorities to a national standards development plan



Combining socio-economic and stakeholder priorities

Data combined into a single priority rank in the standards development plan:

1. Priority ranks derived from economic and social data AND

2. Priority ranks expressed by stakeholders

 The overall priority for each item calculated as the average of socio-economic priority and the priority perceived by stakeholders and expressed in a final rank.

Main Output

Result - A final priority ranking established for the subject or topic for standardization based on desk research and requests obtained from stakeholders
